## **Branch & Limb Pickup Schedule**

The Village of Jerome will be picking up branches and limbs following the schedule below:

Monday, April 4th

Monday, May 2nd

Monday, June 6th

Tuesday, July 5th

Monday, August 1st

Monday, October 3rd

Please note there will be no branch pick-up in September due to Village Wide Clean Up.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT BRANCH PICK-UP

- 1. Place branches and limbs in front of your residence near the road the weekend before the pick-up is scheduled.
- 2. Branches should be of reasonable length to handle (8 ft. or less).
- 3. Residents with limb piles greater than or equal to  $\frac{1}{2}$  a truck load should contact James Foster at 546-9647 to inquire about charge for large load.
- 4. Remember, branches are not logs or twigs and we will not pick up tree trunks, even if they have been cut up.
- 5. No trees, bushes or yard waste (leaves or leaf bags) will be picked up. The facility where we dispose of our branches will not accept the items mentioned here.
- 6. No finished wood products (landscape timber, 2x4s, fence pieces, etc.) will be picked up.
- 7. Branches will not be picked up if trash is mixed in.
- 8. Please give our Public Works employees time to pick up branches. It will take several days each month to complete the pick-up.
- 9. When the branch pick-up is completed in October, please do not place branches or limbs near the road to remain there until the Spring of 2017. Doing so makes our Village appear messy and uncared for.

Evan's Recycling, our branch drop-off location, mulches the wood and uses it for bedding for animals. Animals can and do chew/eat the mulch. Treated lumber and trash could make the animals sick. Please be considerate. Any deviation from this policy could result in your branch piles not being picked up.

## TAKE PRIDE IN YOUR COMMUNITY



Sadly, some areas of our Village have become unsightly. Please make sure you are doing your part to help keep our community an appealing place to live. The following ordinances, as well as other ordinances, will be strictly enforced. Taking steps to be in compliance with Village ordinances will avoid receiving a Ordinance Violation letter and possible fine.

- Ordinance 803.3-4 prohibits parking vehicles in Front, Side or Rear Yards. No person shall keep, store or park any vehicle, trailer or other unit on any front, side or rear yard other than on a driveway or approved pad.
- Ordinance 400.3 states that grass of 6 inches in height, brush, weeds, dead and dying trees or bushes, stumps, roots, limbs, garbage and trash is detrimental to public health and is declared to be a public nuisance.
- Ordinance 400.3-5 requires that receptacles for garbage, ashes and rubbish shall be placed outside and to the <u>rear</u> of the residence or main building. Receptacles may be moved to the street on days scheduled for collection but must be removed to the rear of such residence or other main building as soon as possible after collection is made.
- Ordinance 404.2-2 allows for fire pits to be used in the Village from April 1<sup>st</sup> through November 30<sup>th</sup>. However, a permit application must be approved <u>each year</u>. An application for an Evening Fire Permit is available at the Village Hall. Once the application is completed, please return the application to the Village Hall and you will be contacted to set up a time for the fire pit location to be inspected. <u>The owner</u> of the property must sign the permit. Renters must get the permission of the owner before the application can be approved.
- Ordinance 400.3-6 requires that gutters and ditches in front of your residence be kept free of yard waste and debris. This will aid in the flow of rain water and reduce the amount of debris entering the storm sewers that restrict the flow of water.
- Ordinance 400.3 requires that residents must have stickers from an area waste hauler on leaf/yard waste bags before placing them in front of their property for pick-up. Do not put your yard waste bags out until the required stickers are affixed. No one wants to see rotting yard waste bags along the side of our roads.
- Ordinance 417.1-1 Violation of this ordinance includes: (a) Sound or noise which interferes with the peace or comfort or disturbs the quiet enjoyment of any person in the Village and (b) The use, playing or operating within the Village of any radio, tape recorder, cassette player or other device receiving broadcast sound or reproducing recorded sound if the sound generated by the device is clearly audible to a person with normal hearing at a distance greater than 75 feet.

- Interior and exterior painting (you must supply paint).
- Hang drywall.
- Tuck point brick wall or mend fences.

No roof repairs and major electrical work.


No jobs will be started that cannot be completed by the end of the work days.



#### **MOSQUITO SPRAYING PROGRAM TO BEGIN**



Remember, the most effective way to fight mosquitos is to eliminate breeding locations around your property. It takes only a teaspoon of water for an egg raft, and a female mosquito can make a new egg raft every 3-4 days depositing 100-300 eggs.

### **Mosquito Breeding Sites**



- 1. Keep gutters clean
- 2. Repair leaky faucets
- 3. Eliminate debris that holds water
- 4. Drain excess water from plant pots and saucers
- 5. Change birdbaths twice a week
- 6. Maintain pools and spas; keep water from pooling on covers
- 7. Turn toys and equipment upside down to prevent water from collecting inside
- 8. Avoid overwatering

Help your community reduce mosquito-borne diseases like West Nile Virus by keeping your property free from mosquito breeding sites

#### LET'S STOOP AND SCOOP

If you are a dog or cat owner, please review Ordinance 407.1 to become familiar with regulations regarding your pets. Picking up your pet's waste is regulated by ordinance and will keep our roadways clean and your neighbors happy. It also protects local waterways, since pet waste left on the ground washes into our sewer system and compromises water quality.

When walking your dogs at night, wear reflective patches to ensure your and their safety.

Dogs running at large in the Village will be at risk of being impounded and subject to the regulations and fees established by Sangamon County and the Village of Jerome. It is your responsibility to care for your pet.

## Are you having work done around the house?

The Village of Jerome requires persons or companies working in Jerome to register and pay a registration fee.

Home repair scams become our number one problem this time of year, as the weather becomes warmer and there is more activity outside. Check with our Village Office to see if the company or person you are thinking of doing business with is registered with the Village of Jerome. This requirement helps to safeguard our residents from unprofessional work and unscrupulous scammers. A list of registered contractors is available at the Village office.

Additionally, Building Permits are required for many outdoor projects you may be considering this spring. Always check with me or the Village office to see if you need to complete a Building Permit Application. When in doubt—CHECK! Thank you.
